

F. The Active or Passive Board Game.

You need a dice and some counters. Place your counters on **START** and throw the dice to decide who starts (this is Student A).

Student A throws the dice and moves forward that number of squares. Student B reads the sentence on that square. If Student A answers with the correct form (he/she changes the active voice sentence to a passive voice sentence), Student A's counter remains where it is. If the answer is incorrect, the counter returns to its original square.

Take turns moving around the board. The first player to reach **FINISH** is the winner!

Oh, no! Miss a turn!



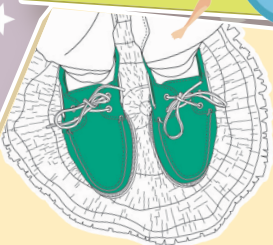

Move ahead 1 space!

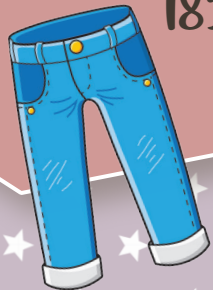


FINISH
