

THE CAUSATIVE FORM GAME

Play in pairs. Imagine that you are flatmates. You need a dice and counters. Roll the dice and move your counters the same number of squares as the dice shows.

Form sentences / answers using the Causative Form. For example, for the first box 'The TV isn't working properly. Can you fix it?' Student A reads the sentence / question and Student B can say 'I'll have it fixed next week'.

If a wrong answer is given, the pair goes back three spaces. The first pair to reach the FINISH box wins the game.

Miss a turn!



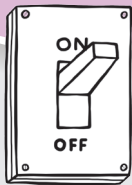

Play again!

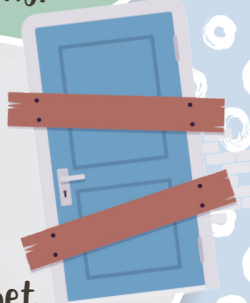


We need to call in an electrician to sort out the wiring.

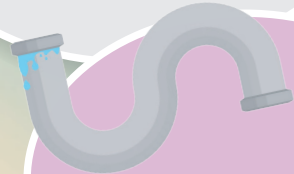


When will you replace the light switch?
